Ladies' Twilight League Guidelines

WELCOME

Our 2010 Breakfast Hill Twilight Ladies' League will once again prove fresh and exciting. This season, Breakfast Hill's golf staff will attempt to establish a unique format for each league night. The league will continue to be as competitive as each player would like to make it. It will be club's recommendation to use these weeks to remain competitive but also to enjoy a scenic and challenging layout with friends and fellow competitors.

ENTRY FEE

The initial – one-time – entry fee to join the ladies' golf league will be \$50 per person in which all of the money will go towards end-of-the-season prizes and banquets. A GHIN handicap is required. For those who do not have an established and active GHIN account will be charged an additional \$25 for activation.

Players will be required to pay a weekly greens fee (carts are an additional \$15):

2010 League Weekly Greens Fee = \$0 (Season Pass Holders); \$15 (Breakfast Club); \$20 (Public)

League fees include the following:

- Pre-league set-up & weekly registration
- Weekly league announcements on website
- 12 weeks of 9-hole greens fees
- Professional scoring following play
- Year end dinner & prizes

LADIES' LEAGUE INFORMATIONAL MEETING

Our annual 2010 Breakfast Hill Ladies' Twilight League informational meeting will be held on May 5, 2010 at 6:00 pm in the Club's Great Room.

FIRST WEEK OF PLAY

The first night of league competition will be May 12, 2009.

STARTING TIMES

Breakfast Hill Golf Club will set aside starting times every Wednesday during the League season from 2:30 p.m. until 5:30 p.m. for league participation. Players may make tee times seven days in advance either in person or by phone at (603)-436-5001, ext. 1. To reserve a starting time, each group must have a minimum of two players. Single players will be assigned a starting time should they want to participate during a given week.

GHIN HANDICAP REQUIREMENTS

All Ladies' League scoring will adopt a net scoring system which is defined as: A player's gross score minus the strokes his or her course handicap allows to be taken during the course of the round. A golfer may have a gross score of 42, but during the round was allowed to take 9 strokes. That player's net score is 33. On an individual hole, the player may have taken six strokes, but be allowed one handicap stroke. The gross score on that hole is a six, the net score is a five.

Anyone who holds a GHIN account will qualify for net scoring. Should a player not have a handicap, he/she would have to use their gross score for official scoring & individual standing.

NEW POINT SYSTEM MIMICS PGA TOUR'S FED EX CUP

Like last season, each player is individual player is competing for league supremacy. New in 2010 will be a new individual stroke-play point system (see Appendix A). During the upcoming season, each participant will play a normal nine-hole round counting all strokes. The Equitable Stroke Control scoring method will be adopted for 2010 (see head golf professional or weekly rules sheets). The aforementioned point system will mimic the PGA Tour's Fed Ex Cup point system.

The Breakfast Hill Ladies' Twilight League point series is being introduced to league participants, for the first time, during the 2010 season. It is a season-long points chase, similar to the PGA Tour's Fed Ex Cup or NASCAR's Nextel Cup, in which golfers accrue points over the course of the year. The top point-getters at the end of the league's regular season and tournament championship receive prizes at the end of the season.

Individual Scoring Basics:

The basic structure of individual play this season during Breakfast Hill Golf Club's Ladies' League is pretty simple:

- Each week golfers earn points based on their finish (1st place, 2nd place, etc.) in Ladies' League weekly events.
- Points add up throughout the season.
- At the end of the "regular season," all players on the points list qualify for the "playoffs."
- The playoffs are a series of four weeks culminating in the league championship, after which the league points champion is crowned.
- The other important thing to note is that point values are quintupled in the playoff events.

League Regular Season:

The "regular season" of Breakfast Hill's Ladies' League series stretches from Week 1 of the league schedule (May 12th) to week nine. At the conclusion of the league regular season, all golfers with advance into the playoffs.

The Playoffs:

At the conclusion of the league regular season, all golfers on the points list advance into the playoffs, a series of three weeks of league culminating in the league championship. Points values available in the playoffs are quintuple those available in regular-season tournaments. (For example, if finishing in X place was worth 300 points in the regular season, it will earn 1,500 points in the playoffs).

The golfer atop to the points list following the league championship is crowned the Ladies' League Champion.

FORMAT

Our hope this year is to present a league in which you can play with your friends, meet some new players and still encounter some friendly competition. Each week will consist of nine (9) holes of play with points awarded based on your end of the evening standing determined by score placement. A new point scoring system has been adopted for the 2010. This system will mimic the PGA Tour's Fed Ex Cup. To view how many points a player can receive based on where they finish during a particular week, please see Appendix A and the conclusion of this packet. Points will never be deducted for those who are not able to attend a given week. Holes are to be played in their entirety & adjusted to your ESC score. USGA rules govern all play.

Weekly formats will change throughout the season and, to avoid any confusion, format rules sheets will be provided on a weekly basis. For example, during a week of competition, the fewest number of putts could garner first place standing. Please check the "league" section of BreakfastHill.COM during the league season for additional weekly format announcements.

RAIN DATES

Due to the flexibility in this season's scheduling, there will be no rain dates in the event of inclement weather. Rain during a given week will result in cancellation (not a postponement) of that week's format. Playoffs will not be rescheduled due to rain.

IDLE DATES ON JUNE 16TH AND JULY 21ST

Please note that there are two weeks during the season that do not have a format associated with them. During these weeks, players are still more than welcome to come play Breakfast Hill Golf Club. The only catch is that no scoring will go towards your overall season-long standing. Please make tee times as you would for any other normal week of competition.

POSTING SCORES

All holes are to be played out in their entirety & adjusted to the mandated weekly ESC score. Each player must post all scores in the GHIN computer. Since we are completing all holes it is imperative that you move along at the expected rate of 2 hours & 15 minutes for 9 holes. Although the professional golf staff should post all league nine-hole scores, please check your GHIN handicap account on a regular basis. Breakfast Hill hosts many leagues and private events that require a great deal of attention. If you notice absent scores in your GHIN account, please notify the head golf professional.

ATTENDANCE

Consistent weekly attendance is requested but is not required for the entire season. Attendance can help individual standings but will not hurt a player's overall standing.

PRO SHOP CREDIT
