USGA RULES GOVERN PLAY

Men's Twilight League Guidelines

GENERAL INFORMATION

The 2010 Breakfast Hill Golf Club Men's Twilight League will consist of at least 22 four-man teams for a total of 88 golfers. Enrollment may be increased at the discretion of Breakfast Hill Golf Club. This 80-golfer enrollment will be the maximum number of players allowed to participate. Play will take place on Tuesday evenings beginning April 27, 2010 and run for 18 weeks (fifteen weeks of competition and three weeks of team play). Registration commences on January 1, 2010. The league will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

* Breakfast Club membership is recommended, but not required, for all members of the general public who wish to sign up for the 2010 league season. Breakfast Club membership is defined as a 20 nine-hole or ten 18-hole round punch card. Breakfast Club membership will cost \$450 for the first card purchased (and \$400 for each additional card purchased) during the 2010 season. Breakfast Club punch cards do not expire. Also included in this membership option are ten complimentary range tokens (also issued via a punch card), a ten-percent discount on all pro shop merchandise, use of clubhouse and the ability to play in all Breakfast Hill organized tournaments. Breakfast Club membership punches are transferable so rounds can be used on family, friends or co-workers. Upon signing up for this membership option, an automatic 15 nine-hole punches will be applied to the card leaving the bearer with a remaining 45-holes to be used anytime. Absences during league season are not subject to refund on the Breakfast Club card.

League fees include the following:

- Pre-league set-up and weekly registration
- All league implementation and organization
- Customized league scorecards
- Pre-league announcements
- 18 Weeks of 9-hole greens fees
- Professional scoring and skins tabulation immediately following play
- USGA handicap card
- Weekly on-course contests
- End-of-season dinner and prizes

TEAMS SELECTED BY DRAFT

This season's format will consist of 22 four-man teams determined by a draft to be held on Tuesday, April 20th. The 22 lowest handicap indexes will be defined as "team captains." The "captains" will then coordinate the draft strategy for their respective teams. The remaining 66 players will be designated B, C or D players based on handicap index. A random draw will determine the order in which the B and D players will be chosen. Remaining C players will be chosen in reverse order of the second-round, "B" selection. The draft will take place in the order of B players first, followed by C and then D players. The draft will conclude once all 66 players have been drafted. Upon concluding the draft, captains may trade players within handicap groups (i.e., B for B, etc). The open trade period will last for ten (10) minutes.

WEEKLY SHOTGUN STARTING TIME

Breakfast Hill Golf Club twilight leagues have a shotgun starting time beginning promptly at 5:00 p.m.

WEEKLY SHOTGUN STARTING TIME

An optional gross and net skins game will be offered every week of the season (entry fee: \$5 gross, \$5 net). Most of you already know how the skins game works, but, just in case there's someone out there who doesn't, here's a brief explanation. There will be 40 players each night on your nine holes of play. Let's assume for the sake of explanation that all 40 players get into the skins

game. You make a 3 on the first hole and not one of the other 35 players on your nine makes better than 4 on the first hole, then you win a skin. A skin may only be won if there is only ONE lowest score on any given hole. If there is, for instance, two fours on number 2 and the other 34 players on that nine on that night made 5 or higher, there is no skin because the two fours cancel each other. One more thing about skins: Please be sure to sign up for skins entry immediately upon arriving at the golf course. Skins sign-up will take place with the golf attendant in the pro shop; doing this will be very helpful in getting us out on time. Each player must declare skins game entry prior to weekly competition.

SPECIAL WEEKLY CONTESTS

On a weekly basis, Breakfast Hill's men's league will offer a total of two closest to the pin contests. One marker will be placed on a par three on the front-nine while the other will be placed on the back nine. A \$20 pro shop credit prize will be awarded to each winner on a weekly basis. There is no added fee to enter this special contest.

TEE MARKERS

Due to the revised 88-person playoff system in 2010, all flights will tee off from the black markers.

*** PLEASE REFERENCE CHANGES TO LEAGUE SCORING BELOW ***
For the first time in five seasons, Breakfast Hill Golf Club has opted to alter ALL league format policies.
All changes are outlined in the following.

Each week will consist of two different nine-hole formats. ALL SCORING (with the exception of skins) WILL ADOPT A NET SCORING SYSTEM. The formats are as follows: 1.) Nine-holes, individual stroke-play; and 2.) Nine-holes, two-man aggregate matches. Please reference each format description listed below:

1. **NINE-HOLES, INDIVIDUAL STROKE-PLAY:** New in 2010 will be an **individual stroke-play point system** (see Appendix A). For the first time in league history, individual competition will not revolve around nine-hole matches pitting opposing players of equal ability level. During the upcoming season, each participant will play a normal nine-hole round **counting all strokes and, if necessary, adjusting them to the proper Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) score** (see Appendix B). The aforementioned point system will mimic the PGA Tour's Fed Ex Cup or NASCAR's Nextel Cup point system. During the 2010 season, golfers will accrue points over the course of the year. The top point-getters at the end of the league's regular season and tournament championship receive prizes at the end of the season.

Individual Scoring Basics:

- Weekly play consisting of nine-hole, stroke play.
- "A" and "B" players compete in one division while "C" and "D" players compete in another. A total of 44 players compete in each division.
- Points based on weekly finish in each division will accrue throughout the season.
- Prizes will be awarded to the top individual regular season winners.
- At the end of the "regular season," all 88 players (44 players in each division) on the points list qualify for the "playoffs."
- The playoffs are a series of four weeks culminating in the league championship, after which the league points champion is crowned.
- Point values are quintupled in the playoff events, and are reset prior to the league championship held during week 15 of competition.
- Absent players from week to week will garner the fewest allowable points (128).

League Regular Season:

The "regular season" of Breakfast Hill's Men's League series stretches from Week 1 of the league schedule (May 4th) to week 11. Each week, golfers, placed in two divisions based on ability level, earn points reflecting their finish in Men's League weekly play (1st place to 40th place). Those points will add up throughout the season.

The Playoffs:

At the conclusion of the league regular season, all 72 golfers advance into the playoffs, a series of four weeks of league culminating in the league championship. After each week of the playoffs, the fields are cut until only ten golfers move on to week 15 or the league championship. Should a player be eliminated from playoff contention, they will still continue playing on a weekly basis, as team points are still obtainable.

The four-playoff tournaments are:

- Week 12 (Playoffs – all 44 players in each division (88 players overall) compete in first round of the playoffs)
- Week 13 (Playoffs – top 24 golfers/point recipients from each division compete)
- Week 14 (Playoffs - top 12 golfers/point recipients from each division compete)
- Week 15 (Championship – top overall 5 golfers/point recipients in each division will compete on same nine-holes)

The cuts in the field each week of the playoffs are determined by ranking on the Men's League season-long points list. For example, following week 12 of the season/playoffs, only the top 24 players from each division on the points list advance to week 13 of individual competition. Everyone else will continue to participate in team (not individual) play.

Points values available in the playoffs are quintuple those available in regular-season tournaments. (For example, if finishing in X place was worth 300 points in the regular season, it will earn 1,500 points in the playoffs). Prior to the series-ending league championship (week 15), the points are reset; the reset gives everyone who makes it to the league championship a shot at winning the Men's League championship.

The golfer atop to the points list following the league championship is crowned the Men's League Individual Tournament Champion.

2. **The NINE HOLES, TWOSOME AGGREGATE** format will count for half of each team's total weekly playing points total. The team two-man aggregate format will be played as follows:

- a. Throughout the season, "A" players will play with their "B" teammates.
- b. Each team of two will be paired against/vs. an opposing team of two players of equal ability classification.
- c. Each team will total their individual net scores for every hole played. Using match-play rules, this score will be compared to the opposing team's total score. For example, John and Joe are on team 1. Mike and Mark are on team 2. Both John and Joe record a score of four on the first hole while Mike scores a 4 and Mark scores a 5 for team 2. Using these two scores, it is determined that team 1 has recorded an aggregate (total) score of eight on the first hole while team 2 has a total of 9. Using a match-play format, team 1 has won the first hole of play going 1-up in the nine-hole match. The team who wins the match will earn one point for their team. Should a team halve a match, both squads would earn a half-point. No points will be awarded to a team who doesn't win their match. Stroke play rules are to be used from tee to green. Match play scoring will take effect following the completion of each hole. Scoring uses A MATCH PLAY FORMAT, POINTS ARE NOT AWARDED (for example, the winning team could win a match 3 & 2 and not six points to three points).
- d. Because two matches will be played at the same time ("A" and "B" players compete on one nine and the "C" and "D" players compete on the other nine), a total of two points are up for grabs during this format.

IMPORTANT: If a player is not in attendance during a particular week, each team will still have an opportunity to garner points in the aggregate team format. Although it will be difficult to win, victory is still possible. The absent player will still compile a nine-hole score using the ESC table (see Appendix B). The maximum amount of strokes will be added to the other player's score in attendance. This total number will constitute the team's two-man aggregate score. If absent, your ESC maximum score will not be entered in the GHIN computer for handicap records.

3. **BONUS POINTS** will be awarded every week to each team based on attendance. For each player who attends on a given week, the team will earn an extra half point per person. So, in essence, a team can earn a total of two points for winning their team matches and another two points should each player attend that particular night of play. As in previous seasons, four points will be maximum number of team points available to win on a week-to-week basis.

INDIVIDUAL POINT QUOTA ELIMINATED

No point quota competition will take place in 2010.

HANDICAPPING INTEGRITY RELIES ON PROPERLY POSTING SCORES

For scoring purposes, all holes are to be played out in their entirety and then adjusted to your ESC (equitable stroke control, see Appendix B for definition) score. A member of the professional golf staff will post all scores in the GHIN computer. Since players are to complete all holes it is imperative that you move along at the expected rate of 2 hours and 10 minutes for 9 holes.

CLUB ELIMINATES MAKE-UP ROUNDS

Breakfast Hill Golf Club will no longer allow participants to make-up any play during the 2010 league season. After three absences, the head golf professional may invite the offender not to return to competition WITHOUT REFUND. A replacement player will be called upon if necessary.

Scoring for each absent player will adopt a nine-hole scoring line based on the appropriate ESC score. The maximum number of strokes allowed will constitute his score for aggregate scoring purposes.

WEEKLY STANDINGS, RELEASES AND UPDATES AVAILABLE BREAKFASTHILL.COM

All information regarding Men’s League can be found throughout the season on the club’s website: BreakfastHill.COM. Once logging onto the home page, click on “golf” and then “leagues” which is located on the right margin. Clicking on the “leagues” link will direct you all things related to the club’s twilight leagues. Weekly pairings and starting hole assignments will be posted by 12:00 pm on the Monday prior to play. Updated individual and team standings will be posted by the Wednesday morning following play.

NO SUBSTITUTES PERMITTED

Unlike other leagues, Breakfast Hill Golf Club does not allow substitutes unless approved by the head golf professional. No substitutes are permitted to play for record unless a participant withdraws from the field due to personal or medical reasons. Once a player has removed himself from the field, he/she is no longer permitted to return for the duration of the season.

NO REFUNDS WILL BE GRANTED

No league refunds will be granted regardless of reasoning. For Breakfast Club members, punches for nine-hole rounds will NOT be refunded for a missed week of play.

WINNERS AND PRIZES ANNOUNCED AT END-OF-LEAGUE BANQUET

Final team and individual prizes will be announced during the end-of-league banquet to be held on the week following the final week of competition (currently scheduled for September 7th at 6:00 pm). Prizes will be awarded to the following winners (subject to change): Regular season first thru fifth place in each division (and ties); tournament championship first thru tenth place (and ties); and first thru fifth place (and ties) team.

PRO SHOP CREDIT EXPIRES AT END OF THE YEAR

All prize credit must be claimed and spent by the close of business on December 31, 2010. All credit remaining after this date will be forfeited.

HOW TO JOIN IN 2011

Enrollment in the Breakfast Hill Golf Club Men’s Twilight League is available on a first-come, first served basis. No preference will be given to Club members or returning league participants. Open registration for next season begins on January 1, 2011.

TEAM WEEKS

In order for teams to meet, greet and form relationships with fellow teammates, a series of “team weeks” are scheduled throughout the season. These weeks do not count toward overall team standings. Cash prize pots will be awarded to winners of each “team week” competition. Formats will vary and will be announced during the league season. These weeks will also be used as regular competition rain dates if necessary. “Team weeks” will not be made up in the event of inclement weather.

APPENDIX B



EQUITABLE STROKE CONTROL (ESC) PROCEDURE HOW TO ADJUST YOUR SCORE...

Equitable Stroke Control (or ESC) is the downward adjustment of the individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential scoring ability. ESC sets a maximum number that the player can post on any hole depending on the player's Course Handicap. A Handicap Index determined from scores to which ESC has not been applied may not be termed a USGA Handicap Index.

Here's how to apply ESC procedure:

1. Convert your USGA Handicap Index to a Course Handicap for the set of tees you are going to play.
2. Use the chart below to look up the maximum score you can post on any hole based on your Course Handicap.
3. If you do not complete a hole, write down the score you most likely would have made. If you do not play a hole or do not play a hole under the Rules of Golf, write down par plus the handicap strokes you would receive on that hole. An "X" should precede such scores. Do not write down your maximum score for an incomplete hole unless your probable score exceeds your maximum score.
4. Once you have completed your round, scan your scorecard to locate any scores higher than your maximum score and reduce them to your maximum score.
5. There is no limit to the number of holes you can adjust.
